1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Central Control Unit (CCU), accompanied by the Independent Observer (Global Witness), undertook a mission to Forest Management Units (FMUs) located in the Boumba and Ngoko Division, from 7 to 11 May 2004. The mission was part of a CCU routine control programme started on 5 May 2004.

The mission visited the current logging sites of the following FMUs:

- o FMU 10 023 granted to the Société Forestière de Commerce et de Service (SFCS), Annual Standing Volume (ASV) No. 05
- o FMU 10 063 granted to the Société Industrielle des Bois Africains (SIBAF), ASV No.21
- o FMU 10 064 granted to the company Filière Bois (FB), ASV No. 04.

In each of these FMUs, the mission inspected the boundaries and logging documents of the valid Annual Standing Volume.

With the exception of the company SFCS, which has signed a subcontracting agreement with the company Transformation Tropical du Sud (TTS), the concession holders manage their FMUs themselves.

A tour of the access roads and hauling tracks of the annual standing volumes of these FMUs did not reveal any infractions.

In view of the above, the Independent Observer recommends that :

- o A control mission targeting these FMUs be conducted at the end of the 2004 fiscal year;
- o The relevant DF10 data recorded in the SIGIF system be examined at the end of the fiscal year.

3. COMPOSITION OF THE MISSION

The mission consisted of Mr Kouotou Aboubakar, agent of the Department of Transformation and Promotion of Forest Products (DTP), Mission Head; Mr Mamene Pierre Marcel and Mrs Manhouli Marie, agents of the Central Control Unit; Mr Afene Obam James, Senior staff at the Permanent Secretariat for the Environment (PSE); and two members of the technical team of the Independent Observer. Mr Ndo Nkoumou, Divisional Delegate of the Environment and Forestry (DDEF) for Boumba and Ngoko, joined the mission.

Mr Joël Augier, Foreman, and Mr Joseph Engoumo, Site Manager of the SIBAF company, took part in the inspection of FMU 10 063.

4 CONSTRAINTS

The mission faced no obstacles in the field.

5. MISSION'S FINDINGS

In the concessions, the mission toured access roads and hauling tracks along the boundaries of the valid annual standing volumes. The mission also inspected the marking of stumps and official logging site documents. No irregularities were observed.

6. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

In view of the above, the Independent Observer recommends that :

- o A control mission targeting these FMUs be conducted at the end of the 2004 fiscal year;
- o The relevant DF10 data recorded in the SIGIF system be examined at the end of the fiscal year.
